WHAT ITEMS CAN BE COLLECTED?

- ✓ Air conditioners
- ✓ Bikes and toys
- ✓ Blinds and window coverings
- ✓ Dismantled clothes lines
- √ Floor coverings (up to 2m)
- ✓ Furniture
- ✓ Hot water services
- ✓ Lawn mowers
- √ Mattresses (restrictions may apply)
- ✓ Rainwater tanks
- ✓ Refrigerators & freezers (remove doors for safety)
- √ Sheets of iron & guttering (up to 2m)
- √ Small items of scrap metal
- √ Timber off cuts (up to 2m)
- √ Washing machines and driers

Please note Maximum of 2m³ (2m x 1m x 1m)/1 trailer load can be placed out for collection.

Place items on kerbside no earlier than 24 hours prior to your booking date. Excess or unacceptable items will not be collected and must be removed from the kerbside by the resident.









WHAT ITEMS CAN'T BE COLLECTED?

- Ammunition, explosives or flares (contact the Police 131 444)
- X Batteries
- Bricks, rocks, dirt, pavers, concrete and building materials
- X Business or industrial waste
- Car tyres or car parts
- Co-mingled recycling, general waste, food and garden organics
- X Fire extinguishers
- X Gas bottles
- Hazardous materials (e.g. asbestos, chemicals, batteries, liquids, motor oils and paints)
- X Items too heavy for two people to lift
- Panels of sheet glass
- ✗ Wooden pallets

Electronic waste (E-Waste e.g. TVs, computers and anything with a battery or cord). Check with your local council or East Waste for E-Waste recycling options. E-Waste is only collected for Adelaide Hills and City of Norwood Payneham and St Peters residents. These items are then taken to an E-Waste recycling facility.

TIPS TO REDUCE HARD WASTE:

AVOID

Avoid or reduce: Purchasing low quality, non-durable items as these may break and need to be disposed of more readily.



Choose to Re-Use: Old Furniture: Refurbish and repurpose into new masterpieces for yourself, to sell or donate them to charity.

Whitegoods and homewares: Second hand items can be purchased for a fraction of the cost of a brand new item.

Sell, Swap, Share or Donate: Durable, good quality items can used again by others. There are several websites promoting the re-use of items through resale, swapping, sharing and donating. This can be done through 'Salvage and Save'. To contact them visit their website at: salvageandsave.com.au.



Garage Sale: Garage sales are a great way to sell and buy second hand goods.



Repair and Restore: If it's broken, why not fix it? There are great 'how to' videos and manuals online. If you haven't got time to do it yourself, take it to a repair shop or get a handyman to help. This will also save you the cost of buying a new item to replace it.



Recycle: Take your unwanted items to a recycling centre. Eg. Electronic waste items.



Compost and mulch: Your tree and shrub prunings can be composted or mulched and used in your home garden. Alternatively you can place small cut up pieces into your green lidded food and garden organics (FOGO) bin.
