Recycle your E-waste!

What is E-waste?

E-waste is any item with a cord, battery or switch that is broken, unrepairable or no longer useful. E-waste is growing at three times the rate of any other waste stream.

Did you know that E-waste is banned from landfill?

Since September 2013, **e-waste** has been **banned** from direct **landfill** disposal across all of **South Australia** under the Environment Protection (Waste to Resources) Policy 2010.

Why waste it? When you can recycle it?

E-waste can contain hazardous materials including heavy metals and glass which if broken or damaged pose an unacceptable environmental hazard.

E-waste can be readily recycled (including 90% of what is used to make televisions and computers), saving valuable, finite resources.

Before deciding to recycle your electronic items, please consider if it could be **repaired, reused or repurposed**.

Electronic Recycling Drop-off Locations

- ♻️ Campbelltown City Council Works Depot, 6 Newton Road, Campbelltown (TV & computer items only). Open Monday to Friday 8am-3pm.



Items Accepted

- Electronic waste (i.e. TV's and computers)
- Personal and laptop computers and all cables
- Tablets, notebooks and palmtops
- Computer monitors and parts (e.g. internal hard drives and CD drives)
- Computer peripherals and accessories (e.g. mice, keyboards, web cameras, USBs)
- Printers, faxes, scanners and multi-functional devices
- All televisions
- **No other electrical and electronic items can be recycled through this scheme** but they can be taken to other locations listed below:

- ♻️ The Good Guys – Hectorville, 60 Glynburn Rd, Hectorville (TV & Computer items only)
- ♻️ Bunnings – Windsor Gardens, 432 North East Road, Windsor Gardens. (small-medium items NO batteries or large items inc. TVs or whitegoods)
- ♻️ Kartaway Transfer Station, Crn Virginia Road and Papagni Ave Newton
- ♻️ Burnside Council Depot, 528 Glynburn Road, Burnside, limited e-waste service, on the fourth Monday of each month (except public holidays), between 8 am- 12pm, with the following requirements:
 - Deposit your e-waste in the storage cage outside the Council Depot.
 - The storage cage will be placed in the car park immediately outside the gate of the Council Depot.
 - Items accepted: e-Waste items that can be carried by one person (no fridges or large items).
- ♻️ Rotary Club St Peters, 46 Henry Street, Stepney (accepts small items – Saturday mornings only)
- ♻️ Officeworks - TechCollect (TV & Computer items only)



Recycle batteries and mobile phones!

Why recycle dead batteries and mobile phones?

Batteries and mobile phones contain valuable metals for reuse into new batteries mobile phones including:



Batteries	Mobile Phones
♻ Cobalt	♻ Gold
♻ Lithium	♻ Silver
♻ Nickel	♻ Copper
♻ Manganese	♻ Platinum
♻ Aluminium	♻ Palladium

Batteries and mobile phones are not recyclable through your yellow kerbside recycle bin as they contain harmful substances which, if not managed properly, could damage the environment or catch on fire. They can be recycled by dropping them off at specific collection points.

Battery and Mobile Phone Recycling Drop-off Location:

- ♻ **Campbelltown City Council Works Depot**, 6 Newton Road, Campbelltown for **household and car batteries**.
- ♻ **Campbelltown Council Office**, 172 Montacute Road, Rostrevor, OR **Campbelltown Public Library**, 171 Montacute Road, Rostrevor, for **mobile phones, batteries, charges and accessories**

Other drop off locations:

- ♻ **ALDI and IKEA stores**: take household batteries (single-use alkaline AA, AAA, C,D &9V) for recycling.
- ♻ **Car/automotive** batteries can be recycled at auto part retailers or service stations.
- ♻ **Mobile phones** can be taken to drop off points at most major mobile phone retailers including **Telstra, Optus, Vodaphone, Samsung** as well as **Officeworks stores**.



Light globes

Household light globes including halogen, incandescent and fluorescent globes can be taken to **Mitre 10, Banner Hardware** and **IKEA stores**. Ask your local lighting store if they provide a recycling service eg. **DeLights** provide a recycling service for a small fee.

Whitegoods

Fridges, freezers and washing machines and other whitegoods can be recycled by suppliers of new products.

- ♻ Ask your retailer if they collect and recycle any whitegoods you are replacing.
- ♻ Items may be dropped to a transfer station, scrap metal recycler or picked-up as part of your **hard waste collection**; go to eastwaste.com.au or call 8347 5111 to book a collection. Denron metals accepts whitegoods including microwaves, dishwashers, fridges (doors need to be removed), washing machines, dryers and air conditioners. Call Denron Metals on 8352 8772 to arrange a time for collection.
